StorageSupplied in 10 mM NaH2PO4, 150 mM NaCl, 0.09% NaN3, 0.1% gelatin, pH 7.2. This product is stable for 12 months when stored at 4°C. Do not aliquot the antibody. Protect from light. Do not freeze.

Specificity/Sensitivity

CD11c (N418) Hamster mAb (PE Conjugate) recognizes endogenous levels of total CD11c protein. This

antibody detects an epitope within the extracellular domain.

Source / Purification This monoclonal antibody was purified from tissue culture supernatant via affinity chromatography.

The purified antibody was conjugated under optimal conditions, with unreacted dye removed from the

preparation.

Description This Cell Signaling Technology antibody is conjugated to PE and tested in-house for direct flow

cytometric analysis in mouse cells.

Background CD11c (integrin αX, ITGAX) is a transmembrane glycoprotein that forms an α/β heterodimer with CD18

(integrin β 2), which interacts with a variety of extracellular matrix molecules and cell surface proteins (1). CD11c is primarily used as a dendritic cell marker. Dendritic cells can be classified into two major types: CD11c+ conventional dendritic cells that specialize in antigen presentation, and CD11c-

plasmacytoid dendritic cells that specialize in type I interferon production (2, 3). CD11c expression has also been observed on activated NK cells, subsets of B cells, monocytes, granulocytes, and some B cell

malignancies including hairy cell leukemia (4-7).

The N418 antibody is widely used as a marker for CD11c expression on the cell types mentioned above

(8,9).
